### **Thinking about having your child's ears pierced?**

Parents should be aware that policy is that all jewellery must be removed for PE lessons. This is for the Health and Safety of everyone taking part :

- Children who have pierced ears must be able to remove them independently for all PE lessons, this includes swimming,
- Earrings must be removed for sport not covered by sticky plasters,
- If the earrings cannot be removed children will miss PE, sporting events and swimming for up to a term. This is very upsetting to both staff and children,
- Infection of piercing and painful ears happen regularly, children become distressed and miss out on lessons.
